



Podunajsko

Part of the Danubian Lowland belonging to Bratislava Region consists of villages in the Senec district. This flat agricultural landscape surrounded by the Danube and its tributary the Little Danube with many gravel pits creates favourable conditions for summer relaxation by the water and in the vicinity of bodies of water. Its centre is the town of Senec where you can find a popular summer destination for locals and foreigners alike – Sunny Lakes, in addition to a water park with wellness. The rivers flowing through the region and the bodies of water are a suitable place for fishing and water sports. The most visited European cycling route – EuroVelo 6 – leads along the bank of the Danube. Along with the other cycling routes in the region, it is suitable for families with children and recreational cyclists.

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

The Little Carpathians

The Little Carpathians subregion stretches along the Little Carpathians mountain range from the village of Sv. Jur to the village of Doľany. In addition to the beautiful nature of the Little Carpathians Protected Landscape Area, there are countless cultural and historical sights. The city of Modra is famous for its pottery industry, the roots of which date back to the 14th Century. The sun-bathed south-eastern slopes of the Little Carpathians provide the ideal conditions for the cultivation of vines. The first vineyards were built by the Romans. The Little Carpathians is the most important wine-growing region in Slovakia. In addition to the high-quality wine tastings, you can try traditional dishes and see interesting places, which can be reached by following hiking trails or cycling trails.

Záhorie

The name Záhorie (behind the mountains) refers to the fact that the region lies behind the Little Carpathians mountains. The region is distinctive for its blown sands on the Záhorská nížina, a plain with pine forests and unique biotopes in the valley of the Morava River preserved due to the decades of forced peace between the so-called Eastern and Western blocks. In Smrdáky, there are thermal baths with unique sulphuric water. A popular tourist site is the well-known technical site Baťa Canal, which currently serves for recreational cruises. Záhorie prides itself on Skalický trdelník (a kind of spit cake from Skalica) and Skalický rubín (red wine called Ruby of Skalica), both of which received a European Union trade mark. Athletes can play golf, go hiking or cycling in the Little Carpathians.
